BACKGROUND AND ORIGIN

The Middle East Academy for Medicine of Ageing was founded in 2002 to stimulate the development of health care services for older people in the region. Abyad Medical Center and Middle East Longevity Institute were instrumental in organizing the first course of the MEAMA. Over the previous years several reputable official governmental, regional and international organisations helped in the development of the academy.

CURRENT COURSE

This intensive study course has been built up with 4 sessions, each of 4 days, which cover important topics of health-related problems in older people. It is directed towards physicians, nurses, social workers, and health care officers, responsible for the health care of older people. In addition to faculty members of medical, nursing, social and physiotherapy schools interested in developing the field of geriatrics and gerontology. A certificate will be issued by the Group of Executive Board of the MEAMA after successfully conclusion of the four sessions. The first two courses took place between 2003-2005, and 2008-2010. The Third Course is accredited by Multimedia University-MMU-Australia. It is counted toward 24 postgraduate credits of any of the degrees offered by the University including:

- 1- Master of Science in Geriatrics and Gerontology (60 credits)
- 2- Postgraduate Diploma in Geriatrics and Gerontology (36 credits)
- 3- Certificate in Geriatrics and Gerontology (24 credits)

Each session will grant the participant 6 credit hours of course work and participant can elect to enroll in the University to finish one of the above degrees.

Prof.dr. worked as a nursing home physician and as head of the Department of Medicine and Allied Therapies (physiotherapy and occupational therapy) in Nursing Home and Rehabilitation Center "Amstelhof" in Amsterdam, the Netherlands.
